So what's going on around Village Hall and the Village these days?

- Thanks for your patience while the crosswalks on Main Street were replaced over that the past couple of weeks. While we know it caused an inconvenience we needed to get them replaced while the State warranty was still in effect. Contrary to popular belief, the crosswalks were NOT damaged by the snowplows but rather the sprawling was a result of a concrete problem.
- CPI is now a memory and we are currently working with CPI and a development firm to determine the best use for future development to meet the needs of our community
- The old Municipal building on State and Mill Ave. will be disappearing (demoed) in the upcoming weeks as we have completed the relo-

cation of our DPW. The site will be used for future redevelopment as a part of the CDA (community development authority) overall plan

- The 2012 budget process has begun with every department being advised they need to reduce their budget by 10% pending final numbers for our State shared revenue and State highway aids. We will be looking at everything possible to try and not reduce any services currently offered.
- Work continues on School Yard Park (State and 12th)
- Have you seen the new "Village of Union Grove" signs with the updated 2010 population numbers?

We are currently looking for committee members for the following committees and commissions: Community Development Authority, Library Board and Zoning Board of Appeals. If interested in further information please let us know or stop by Village Hall and ask for an application. In order to get new ideas and views we encourage anyone from age 18-100 to apply.

A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF CZERNIAK

Since summertime is the favorite time of the year for many, I will write short so you can read fast and get back to enjoying the ever changing Wisconsin weather! As such, here are some tips on how to keep cool this summer and keep safe in hot weather:

- Never leave children, disabled persons, or pets in a parked car even briefly. Temperatures in a car can become life threatening within minutes. On an 80-degree day, the temperature inside a car even with the windows cracked slightly can reach 100 degrees in less than 10 minutes!
- Keep your living space cool. Cover windows to keep the sun from shining in. If you don't have an air conditioner, open windows to let air circulate. When it's hotter than 95 degrees, use fans to blow hot air out of the window rather than to blow hot air on your body. Basements or ground floors are often cooler than upper floors.
- Slow down and limit physical activity. Plan outings or exertion for the early morning or after dark when temperatures are cooler.
- Drink plenty of water and eat lightly. Don't wait for thirst, but instead drink plenty of water throughout the day. Avoid alcohol or caffeine and stay away from hot, heavy meals.
- Wear lightweight, loose-fitting, lightcolored clothing. Add a hat or umbrella to keep your head cool...and don't forget sunscreen!



Here are some simple safety tips from June's Lightning Safety Awareness Week:

• If you hear thunder, lightning is close enough to pose an immediate threat. Don't be

fooled by blue skies; seek shelter immediately. Remember: When Thunder Roars...Go Indoors!

- A fully enclosed building with wiring and plumbing offers the best protection. Sheds, picnic shelters and covered porches DO NOT protect you from lightning. Stay inside a safe building or vehicle for at least 30 minutes after you hear the last clap of thunder.
- Because water pipes conduct electricity, don't take a bath or shower or use other plumbing during a storm.
- Stay away from isolated tall trees, towers or utility poles. Lightning tends to strike taller objects in an area.
- Get an Emergency Weather Radio. It will alert you to the threat of severe thunderstorms in your neighborhood.

To close, remember batteries for your smoke alarms and be sure to purchase a CO monitor as they are now mandated by law. Have a safe and enjoyable summer, and we won't be upset if you don't need to call us for any fire or rescue services!

History Seekers of the Union Grove Area – Made up of amateur and professional historians, collectors, readers, writers, packrats and storytellers, this group has been meeting informally for over two years. One of our great partners is the Union Grove Graham Public Library. The Library has generously preserved and provided space for some well organized historical and genealogical collections. Trace your family tree using the genealogical note cards on hundreds of local citizens.

With the recent purchase of some recording equipment the History Seekers will be focusing on an "Oral History Project". Oral history is defined by the Oral History Association as "a method of gathering and preserving historical information through recorded interviews with participants in past event and ways of life." The History Seekers will be looking for people who have a story to tell about life in the Union Grove area or who knows someone who does.
