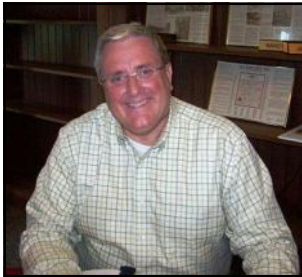

Recycling Helpful Hints:

- Anything made with fiber can be recycled, so please recycle your books and magazines.
- Please break down cardboard to make it easier to handle.
- #1-6 plastics are accepted (no packaging Styrofoam please).
- Please rinse co-mingles and please NO GARBAGE in your recycling bins. (Co-mingling recycling consists of glass bottles, jars, tin & bi-metal cans, aluminum containers, cans, plastic containers #1-#6)
- Fluorescent Light Disposal: Home Depot, 2429 S. Green Bay Road (Hwy 31), takes all fluorescent lighting for recycle. Just bring your fluorescent lights to the service desk and they will recycle for you.



Electronics recycling fact: Over 24 million pounds of electronics were recycled through E-Waste Wisconsin in 2010. That would be enough to fill Lambeau Field 30 feet high! During Union Grove's 2011 E-Waste Drives, more than 14 tons of E-Waste were collected and recycled—THANK YOU!

Please keep recycling for a greener Union Grove.

WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT... THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT TO BE RECYCLED:

- NO garbage
- NO Styrofoam containers or pellets
- NO plastic take-out food containers
- NO plastic cups, plates or utensils
- NO paper towels, plates or napkins
- NO light bulbs
- NO toxic containers (antifreeze, oil, etc.)
- NO disposable diapers or rags
- NO lids or caps
- NO syringes
- NO window glass or mirrors
- NO plastic bags

VILLAGE TIDBITS

Village Dumpsters Discontinued

As of January 1, 2012 the Village will no longer be providing free dumpsters for residential use. If you need a dumpster there are several companies you could contact, if you need assistance please call the Village of Union Grove offices at 262-878-1818.

Black Garbage Bags

Black bags are not allowed for garbage. All garbage must be placed in clear or white plastic bags. The reason behind this is we are a mandatory recycling community. If you are using black bags please discontinue; ASDA has been notified to not pick them up.



Odd or Even Side Overnight Parking Permitted

From November 15 through March 15, overnight parking shall be permitted only on the even-numbered side of the street on the nights bearing an even calendar date during the hours from 2:00 am to 6:00 am, and on the odd-numbered side of the street on those nights bearing an odd calendar date during the hours from 2:00 am to 6:00 am on any street in the village, except Main Street. Please note that the ordinance is in effect whether or not there is snow.

Dog & Cat Licenses

Dogs and Cats in the Village **MUST** be licensed. Many residents think that because cats are kept indoors they do not need to be licensed. That is not true! Current licenses will expire December 31, 2011, and the deadline for licensing without penalty is April 1, 2012.

A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF CZERNIAK

Even though you will be reading this long after Fire Prevention Week, I think it's fitting to say a few things about fire prevention and safety, especially when the 2011 slogan was "Protect Your Family from Fire".

Please remember to change your smoke alarm batteries. And don't forget; you should replace your alarm every ten years.



Candle Safety:

- Candles should be at least 12" away from everything.
- Never leave a child alone in a room with a burning candle.
- Don't let candles completely burn down.
- Never use candles if oxygen is being used in the home.
- Don't use candles during a power outage (bet you never heard that before); have flashlights and extra batteries instead.
- A candle fire in the home is reported every 30 minutes and 1/3 of home candle fires start in the bedroom.

- Use flameless candles – they look and smell real and aren't a fire hazard.

With the Prevention theme in mind, it is urged that you develop a home fire escape plan, and be sure to practice it twice a year. We've taught all preschool—fourth graders to do this, so your action and support reinforces how important it is to have a plan.

Have you used the improved intersection of 67th Drive and Highway C? Please use good driving etiquette and skill to help avoid accidents. This intersection has been labeled as the deadliest intersection, and we want to change that. Be especially aware of the effects of sun and glare, which can make it very difficult to see.

Whenever in a life threatening situation, remember, do not hesitate to call 911 and let us help you. We have highly trained volunteer members who will assist you. So, enjoy our wonderful Wisconsin winter, and stay fire safe.

Please note that there has been a change to the Municipal Code regarding snow and ice removal from

clear the sidewalk; you will be charged for the actual labor cost of removal by the village. There will be no notifications; after 24-hours they will clean and bill.

UNION GROVE AREA FUND

Have you ever heard of the Union Grove Area Fund? If so, do you know what it is? The Union Grove Area Fund was established in 1995 with a \$100,000 bequest from the estate of James R. Reitsma, a local dairy farmer. But don't let the name fool you—the residents of Yorkville benefit from this fund, too. Reitsma's purpose for making such a generous donation was to support and enhance the fire/rescue squad services for the Union Grove area, and to improve safety and welfare for the community as a whole. Since 1995, several other donations have been received. Funds are kept on deposit with the Racine Community Foundation as a separate Union Grove Area Fund, and are managed by a local Board of Advisors. The five-member board meets annually to consider grant applications, or by special request as needed.

The majority of the grants awarded are those that fit the guidelines established in the bequest of James Reitsma. The grant application asks for a description of the project for which funds are being sought, including specific objectives. Other details needed are the project start and end date, the amount of funds requested from the Union Grove Area Fund, other sources of support being approached, and the amount of any funds already received or pledged.

In keeping with the terms of the original bequest, the Union Grove Area Fund has awarded several grants over the years to the Union Grove/Yorkville Fire & Rescue Department for the purchase of equipment that was needed to better serve the surrounding community. Grants have also been awarded to Leadership Union Grove, Shepherds Ministries, and most recently to Yorkville United Methodist Church for help with installing a new well. The church is in the process of qualifying as a disaster relief site for the rural Yorkville/Union Grove area.

Making a contribution to this fund is an excellent way to give back to your community; you can make a tax-deductible contribution at any time or leave a bequest in your will. Whatever the amount of your donation, your contribution will help make a difference in your community!

If desired, you may specify an area of interest and your wishes will be followed whenever possible as grants are awarded.
