This list of basic snow plowing procedures is not a mandatory plan of operation, but a suggested plan for Managing snow removal in the Village of Union Grove. Each storm occasion and developing conditions Require consideration of removal methods and tools for salting and plowing.

Priority 1 roads are high traffic areas and school zones Priority 2 roads are roads that lead to main high traffic roads Priority 3 roads are all other residential areas

Snow	2″-5″	Will plow to maintain all streets on plow routes. Continue to salt* intersections,
Snow	2 -5	hills, and curves if needed.
		Will continue to plow to maintain all main roadways for emergency vehicle
Snow	6"+	traves. (Plow operators may be directed to clear paths for emergency vehicles)
